Logo: Only your specific event logo can be represented on stage; never the TEDx logo (without your place name), and never the TED logo.

## **Stage Design Rules and Guidelines**

**Well-placed screen:** You'll want to place your projection or video screen where the audience won't have to turn their heads to see it -- but also where it won't interfere with the live speaker.



Include a **Timer** and a monitor with **Slides** for Speakers

Rug: Use a rug on stage to put the focus on speakers
